Description: As the global community searches for ways to achieve the sustainable development goal of a quality education for all by 2030, education technology is widely accepted to be part of the solution. At the same time, the risk of wasting limited resources on innovative but unproven education technologies highlights the importance of rigorous monitoring and evaluating. The aim of this session is to provide multilateral, bilateral, and INGO education professionals with examples of evaluation approaches that have proven useful when measuring learning gains in EdTech programs. This interactive session will describe and compare tools used to monitor and evaluate EdTech programs, especially those aimed at improving foundational learning skills. Description: This session will feature a discussion about the GPFs for Reading and Mathematics and what education game developers (tech and non-tech) should know about these standards for future product development and acceptance by national education authorities.
