Activities, including those co-hosted with the International Rescue Committee's Summer Academy for middle and high-school aged refugee learners, will include:

- Team-building, playground activities
- Educational games, including chess, math dice, and other tabletop and board games
- Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (S.T.E.A.M.) instruction
- Digital Literacy, educational software, and career preparedness
- High-quality edutainment videos (e.g., nature and science documentaries), and
- Field trips to museums (e.g., Smithsonian's Air and Space, National Geographic Society)

Your financial and in-kind support will help underwrite the purchase of physical and digital educational games and other resources, including laptops, and underwriting youth facilitators from the community.

We hope that the training activities and lessons learned at this first Wondrous Learning Center will be replicable and scalable in a variety of US and international locations.
